

Public Awareness

Recently, Felton Borough completed 3 water tests in a tributary off of Pine Run and the following results were received.

- **Sample #1:** Total Coliform >201, E.Coli 41 and Surfactants <.05
- **Sample #2:** Total Coliform NA, E.Coli NA and Surfactants <.05
- **Sample #3:** Total Coliform >201, E.Coli 101 and Surfactants <.05

As per DEP, Pine Run is an impaired stream due to urban runoff, Flow regime modification and Agriculture/Siltation.

Snow Information

Snow Emergency – If 6 inches of snow has fallen within a 24 hour period, the snow emergency for **High Street & Main Street** will automatically be in effect. Also, if they are calling for 6 or more inches of snow, a snow emergency may be declared and a press release will be done. After a snow emergency press release has been issued, you will have 1 hour to remove your vehicle from the street. If a vehicle is on the street during a snow emergency, the police will be called and the vehicle will be towed at the owner's expense.

Shoveling – You cannot shovel; blow, plow or otherwise deposit snow onto the street after the street has been plowed. In accordance to Ordinance No. 2005-02 each resident of Felton Borough shall remove and clear away or cause to be removed or cleared away snow and/or ice the entire width and length of the sidewalk within 12 hours after the end of any snow, sleet or freezing rain.

Felton Borough Tax Rate

The Felton Borough Municipal tax millage rate for 2023 **will remain** at 3 mills.

The quarterly fee for garbage collection will increase to \$99 per quarter starting with the March 30, 2023 billing.

Animal Control Services

Felton Borough contracts with Klugh Animal Control Services to respond to the following issues:

- Dog bites, quarantines and warnings between normal business hours.
- Pick up stray dogs in custody.
- Handle dogs according to the terms set forth by the PA Dog Law.
- Attempt to return stray dogs to their owner.
- Set up a trap for an animal other than a cat or a dog.

Felton Borough contracts with SPCA to provide the following services to the residents of the borough:

- The York County SPCA will accept and care for owner surrendered animals and attempt to find those animals a permanent and loving home
- Accept stray animals from residents and our Animal Control Officer that are transported to the shelter contingent upon the policies set forth in the York County SPCA's Managed Shelter Admission Policy.
- Provide low-cost spay/neuter surgeries, including programs for free roaming cats and cat colonies. Also provide discounted spay/neuter surgeries for pit bull and pit bull mixes.

- Receive services from the following programs:
 - CARMA
 - SafePet
 - Pet Pantry
 - Community Cat Initiative
 - Second Chance Fund
 - Shelter Neuter Return Program
- Fulltime Humane Society Policy Officer who investigates and prosecutes animal cruelty offenders.
- Yearly and Lifetime dog licensing
- No cost humane education programs and events for York County residents.

A New Tool to Protect York County Property Owners!

You may have recently heard about a frightening fraud trend, property title and/or deed theft.

Property title theft often occurs when a bad actor steals your identity and then creates fraudulent deed transfer documents that appear as though you have signed them. In response to this trend, some companies have offered paid monitoring services to help protect your property against these types of attacks. However, if you own property in York County, then the Recorder of Deeds Office has just made it easier and free for you to monitor recordings related to your property.

Signing up is free and easy.

Navigate to the Recorder of Deeds page on the York County website, or use the link provided below. Click on the link for Records Notification Service: Sign Up, and select the additional link to subscribe. Then enter your preferred email address and the 18-digit property ID number, found on your county tax bill or by lookup offered on the registration page. After you click sign up you check your email and confirm your desire to activate your account. If there is a document recorded relating to your property ID number after you sign up you will get an alert notification from the service. The link to subscribe can be found here:

It is important to note that this service only sends notifications for documents filed after you sign up. Also, as with similar paid services, the County Records Notification Service does not prevent the fraud from initially happening but instead alerts you to an issue allowing you to dispute the transfer or other fraudulent activity tied to the property early and before the fraudulent activity becomes more difficult to reverse.

Additional protections are available. In addition to utilizing this free service, you should consider purchasing title insurance on any new property that you are buying. Title insurance provides additional protection against fraud.

COVID-19 ARPA PA Small Water & Sewer Grant

The borough applied for a grant on December 21st to replace the storm sewers on Red Lion Avenue. This project will replace the storm sewers on the west side of Red Lion Avenue and also install new storm sewers on the east side to capture the storm waters that are currently directed behind the homes on that side. The borough expects to find out in the spring whether we have been awarded the grant.

CDBG Grant

This grant is to replace the handicap ramps on Main Street and install a new handicap ramp at the corner of High Street and Main Street.

The borough is still waiting on the permit from Penn Dot. The grant has been extended into 2023. Once the permit is received it will be put out for bid and work completed in the spring of 2023.

Multi Modal Grant

The borough was awarded a Multimodal grant through Penn Dot to do improvements on Water Street and Moore Lane. The borough has been working with a Penn Dot representative to get all the paperwork done in order to start the project. Construction for this project will now take place in 2023.
