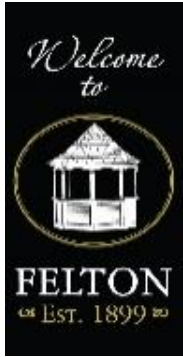

Winter Stormwater Pollution Prevention Tips

Start shoveling early! The more snow you remove, the less salt and sand you'll need. Below are some dos and don'ts when shoveling or plowing snow.

DO

1. Pile snow in locations with the most opportunity to infiltrate into the ground.
2. Pile snow in areas where water does not pond.
3. Clear away any snow that may have been thrown onto the storm drains.

DON'T


1. Do not pile snow on top of storm drains or near water bodies and wetlands.
2. Do not pile snow onto rain gardens or bioretention areas.

TIPS TO AVOID USING SALT AS A DEICER

More salt does not equal more melting snow. Follow product

instructions when spreading deicing material and give it time to work. Sweep up any material remaining after the snow/ice melts. When temperatures hit 15° F or below, salt is not effective. Consider using traction materials that contain an acetate, potassium chloride, magnesium chloride, or cracked cornmeal instead of sand or kitty litter.

Normal snow accumulation does not pose a threat to rain gardens, so there is no need to shovel a rain garden. However, heavy snow loads can weigh down and saturate your garden and hurt plants. Pile snow uphill from the rain garden so when the snow melts the rain garden can do what it is designed to do.

 Pay close attention to places that may have eroded during the snow melt. Plan to improve these areas in the spring by using native grasses, meadow plants, or native trees and shrubs.

Grants Update:



COVID-19 ARPA PA Grant

The borough has been awarded a grant to complete this project. The grant will replace and install new stormwater controls on Red Lion Avenue in the borough. The borough will receive more information on the grant over the next few months.

CDBG Grant

The borough received the Penn Dot permit and put the project out for bid. No bids were received in December so the project will be placed out for bid again. The grant will pay for the installation of handicap accessible ramps all along Main Street and at the corner of High Street and Main Street.

Multi Modal Grant

The borough has received the executed signed agreement with Penn Dot. The bid documents are currently being reviewed by Penn Dot. Once they are approved the project will then be put out for bid.

This project will be reclamation and paving of Water Street from the Beaver Street Bridge to Main Street and Moore Lane from Water Street to Church Avenue.

Snow Information

Snow Emergency – If 6 inches of snow has fallen within a 24-hour period, the snow emergency for **High Street & Main Street** will automatically be in effect. Also, if they are calling for 6 or more inches of snow, a snow emergency may be declared and a press release will be done.



After a snow emergency press release has been issued, you will have 1 hour to remove your vehicle from the street. If a vehicle is on the street during a snow emergency, the police will be called and the vehicle will be towed at the owner's expense.

Shoveling – You cannot shovel; blow, plow or otherwise deposit snow onto the street after the street has been plowed. In accordance to Ordinance No. 2005-02 each resident of Felton Borough shall remove and clear away or cause to be removed or cleared away snow and/or ice the entire width and length of the sidewalk within 12 hours after the end of any snow, sleet or freezing rain.
