CDBG Grant

Work to replace all the handicamp ramps on Main Street and install a switch back ramp at the corner of High Street and Main Street will begin the week of July 8th.

Multi Modal Grant

Bids have been received and the project will be awarded at the July 8th meeting. This project will be reclamation and paving of Water Street from the Beaver Street Bridge to Main Street and Moore Lane from Water Street to Church Avenue.

COVID-19 ARPA PA Grant

This project is out for bid and should be awarded at the August meeting. This project will replace and install new storm water controls along Red Lion Avenue in the borough.

Local Shares Grant – Church Lane

The borough was awarded a Local Shares grant to redo Church Lane in the borough. Keep an eye out for more details to come.

Beware of Ticks and Lyme Disease

Pennsylvania leads the nation with the number of Lyme disease cases. While we are lucky to have access to the many outdoor recreational opportunities in the commonwealth, they come with the risks of tickborne diseases.

Use insect repellent when spending time outdoors, treat your clothing and gear with permethrin and conduct a tick check when you come inside.

There are three stages of Lyme disease with [distinct signs and symptoms](#) occurring in each stage, including a bullseye rash, headaches, nerve pain, heart palpitations and fever. If you discover a tick, [safely remove it](#), put it in a plastic bag and mail it to the [Pennsylvania Tick Research Lab](#) for free testing. Within three business days, you will know if the tick carried Lyme disease and other diseases – valuable information for you and your health care provider.

Beat the Heat - Summer Stormwater Management

Temperatures are beginning to ramp up this summer, and we wanted to provide some quick stormwater tips to help homeowners conserve water and prevent pollutants from entering our local waterways. Please consider the following:

1. Wash your car at a car wash.

Washing your car in your driveway or in the street can cause grease, soap, oil, and other pollutants from your car to wash into our stormwater system and eventually into nearby streams and creeks.

2. Direct downspouts over porous, unpaved surfaces. Where possible, direct downspouts into garden beds or other grassed / vegetated areas to help absorb more rainwater before it enters the street. You can also consider installing rain barrels to capture and re-use water.

3. Raise your mower height. Raising your mower height to at least 3 inches will slow down the flow of water over your lawn and allow it to absorb more rainwater.

4. Change your watering habits during times when it is hot or there is a drought. The timing of water use can make a big difference for conserving water and saving money on your water bill.

- Plan to water in the early morning or evening to beat daytime evaporation.
- Step on your grass, if the grass springs back, it does not need water. Grass is also not really meant to be bright green in the summer.
- Longer grass promotes a more drought-resistant lawn, reduces evaporation, and has fewer weeds.
- Sweep driveways, sidewalks, and steps rather than hosing them off.
