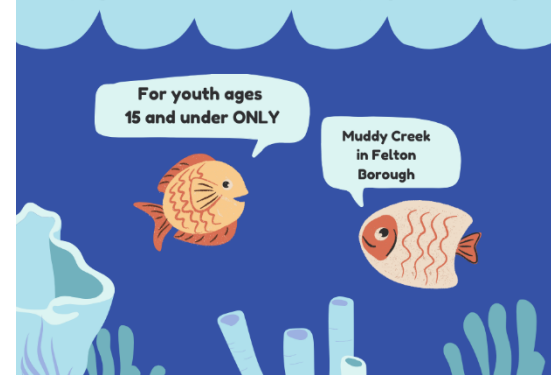

## Awarded Grants Update:

**Multi Modal Grant:** The remainder of this project, Moore Lane will be completed this spring.

**COVID-19 ARPA PA Grant Red Lion Ave Storm drainage:** The borough will be putting the project out for bid soon.

**Local Shares Grant Category 4 & Statewide Grant – Church Lane:** The borough has been awarded the statewide grant as well. The project has been awarded to Restuccia Construction and the project will be completed this spring / summer.

**Open Spaces Grant:** The borough has been awarded this grant to complete a parking area at the borough's playground. The borough is in the process of applying for the necessary permits to proceed with the project.

## Seeking Grants:

**Local Share Grant 2025 Main St Stormwater Replacement & Parking Area at Playground:** The borough has applied for a grant to replace the storm drainage on Main Street in the borough and to install parking spaces at the borough's playground located at 13 Church Avenue.

## **Public Water Discussion**

Over the past year, the borough has been made aware of water issues in the borough by way of PA One Call Alerts of wells being drilled, speaking with residents and social media. Borough Secretary, Joy Flinchbaugh, has relayed this information to the Council in conversation. At the February 2, 2025 council meeting, the topic was brought up and the Council decided to reach out to The York Water Company for more information on public water for the borough.

On February 12<sup>th</sup> an informal meeting was held with the York Water Company to discuss the situation and the possibility of public water for Felton Borough. The following are the notes from that meeting. Those in attendance were JT Hand President and Chief Executive Officer & Matt Scarpato, Vice President of Operations for The York Water Company, Borough Secretary Joy Flinchbaugh & Council Member Zac Klock. Council Member James Vergos came towards end of meeting.

- York Water is willing to look at bringing public water into the borough again. JT mentioned that they have 2 other municipalities that have approached them as well. This area, York County, currently has a 2' deficit of rainfall.
- York Water has recently acquired the Chanceford Crossings sewer and may be looking at expanding

the Felton Sewer plant to accommodate those users.

- York Water would need to look at the number of public water connections to determine if there would be a tap in fee or not. There are some options they would need to look at again to see which would be the best way to bring water into the borough.
- They, The York Water Co, would need for the borough to enact a Mandatory Connection ordinance.
- Zac Klock, asked if those on the sewer would be able to be charged by their water consumption since the water is metered. JT Hand said that would be the goal.
- Joy Flinchbaugh mentioned that the biggest complaint when the sewer went in was that it was not mandatory connection for everyone in the borough. Probably the best way to approach an ordinance would be to have a mandatory connection for the whole borough and you need to connect if the line is in front of your house and you are within 150'.
- JT Hand said that they would not be part of a public meeting without having the Council onboard.
- JT Hand also mentioned that they, The York Water Co, could suggest contractors to bid the work and do multiple connections to provide a discount.

- The process would start with an application to the PUC (Public Utility Commission) to approve the York Water Co. to provide public water to the borough. This process usually takes 6 months. It would make the process quicker if the borough Council would provide a letter as well as letters from the residents who need water. A letter from Rep. Wendy Fink supporting would help also.
- One of the complaints from last time was what is in their water. JT Hand mentioned that they perform 72,000 water tests per year.
- The next step is for the Borough Council to decide if they want to move forward with a mandatory public water connection ordinance and start that process with Attorney Jeff Rehmeyer, borough solicitor. In the meantime, York Water will look at the number but not spend too much time on it until they have some type of confirmation from the borough.

At the March 3rd council meeting there were borough residents present to voice their need for public water as well as those that are opposed. Right now, the borough continues to gather more information from the York Water Company and information from the residents of the borough.
